Barbara J. Safriet served as Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and Lecturer in Law at Yale Law School from 1988 to 2007. In addition to her academic administrative duties, she taught seminars on *Health Law & Policy* and *The Regulation of Health Care Providers*. She is currently teaching as a Visiting Professor of Health Law at Lewis & Clark Law School in Portland, Oregon.

She has served as a member of The Pew Health Professions Commission, and its Taskforce on Health Care Workforce Regulation, and as a Health Law Consultant and Presenter for the Rockefeller Foundation, the W. K. Professor Safriet has published and lectured extensively on topics of administrative and constitutional law, issues of health care professionals' licensure and regulation, and health care workforce problems.
