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PRE-LICENSURE NURSING EDUCATION PROGRAMS

SUMMARY OF ANNUAL REPORTS

July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021

The Summary of Annual Reports provides data and information about Ohio pre-licensure nursing education programs for the time period of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021 (FY21). Pre-licensure nursing education programs with Full Approval, Provisional Approval, or Continued Conditional Approval are required to submit an Annual Report to the Board in accordance with Rule 4723-5-05(A), Ohio Administrative Code.

For the reporting period, reports were submitted by 108 registered nursing (RN) programs and 71 practical nursing (PN) programs. Of the 108 RN programs, there are 45 baccalaureate degree programs, 44 associate degree programs, 14 diploma programs, and 5 direct entry graduate programs.

The first section of the Report provides data for RN education programs. The second section provides the same data for PN education programs. This report and the raw data are available on the Board website at www.nursing.ohio.gov.

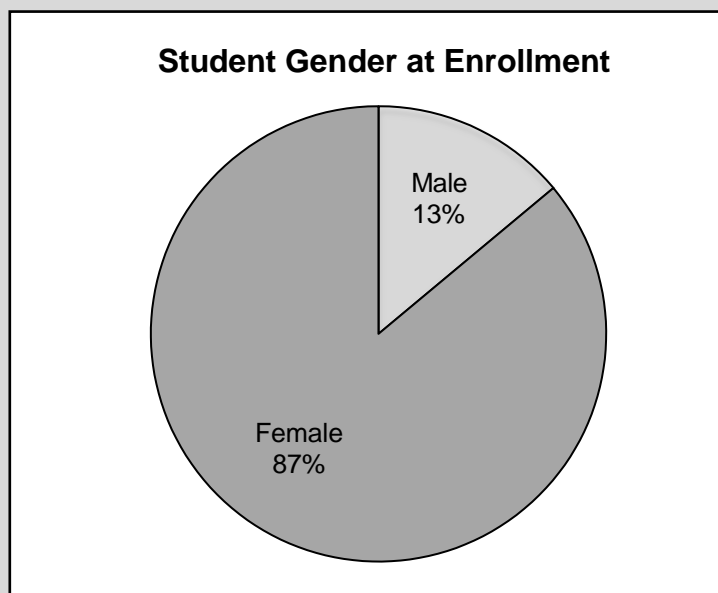

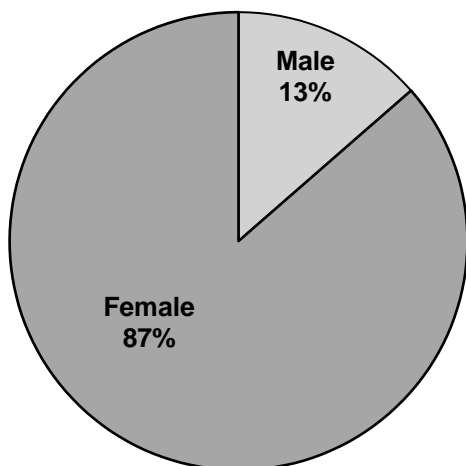

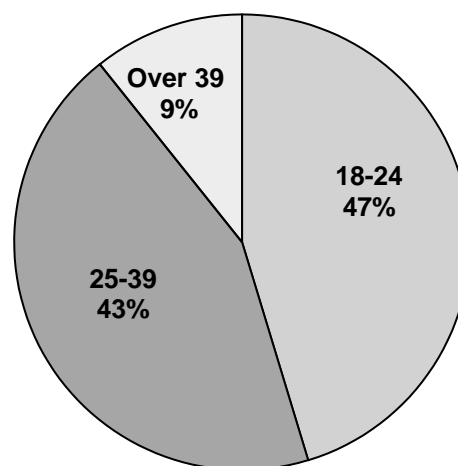

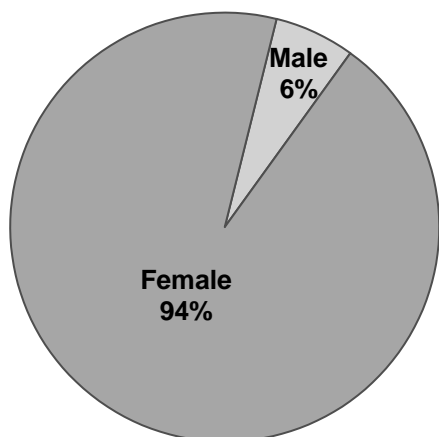

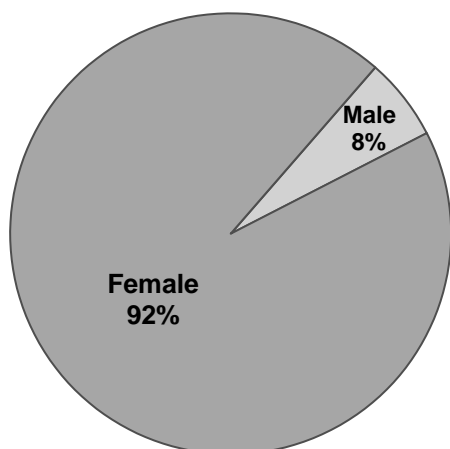

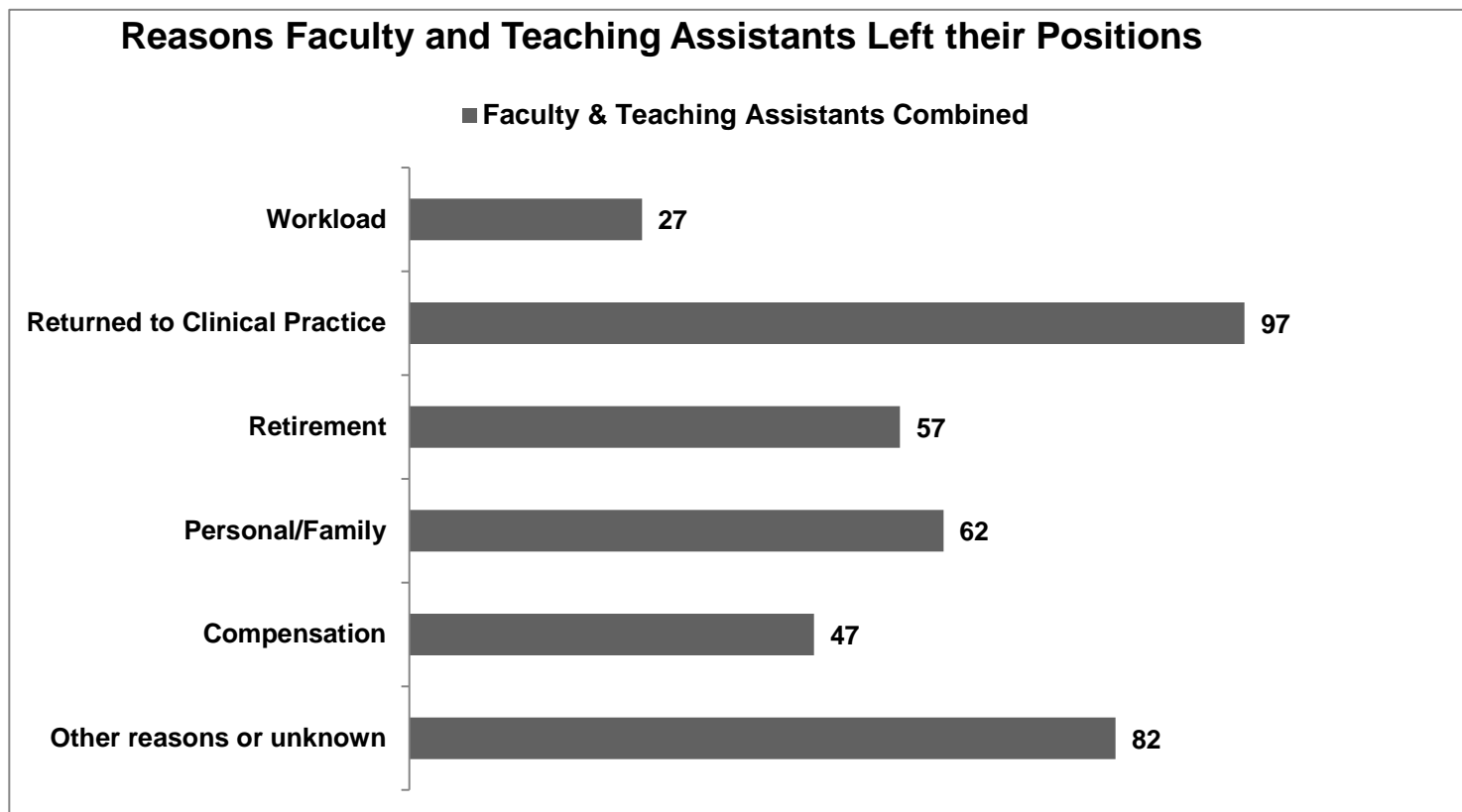

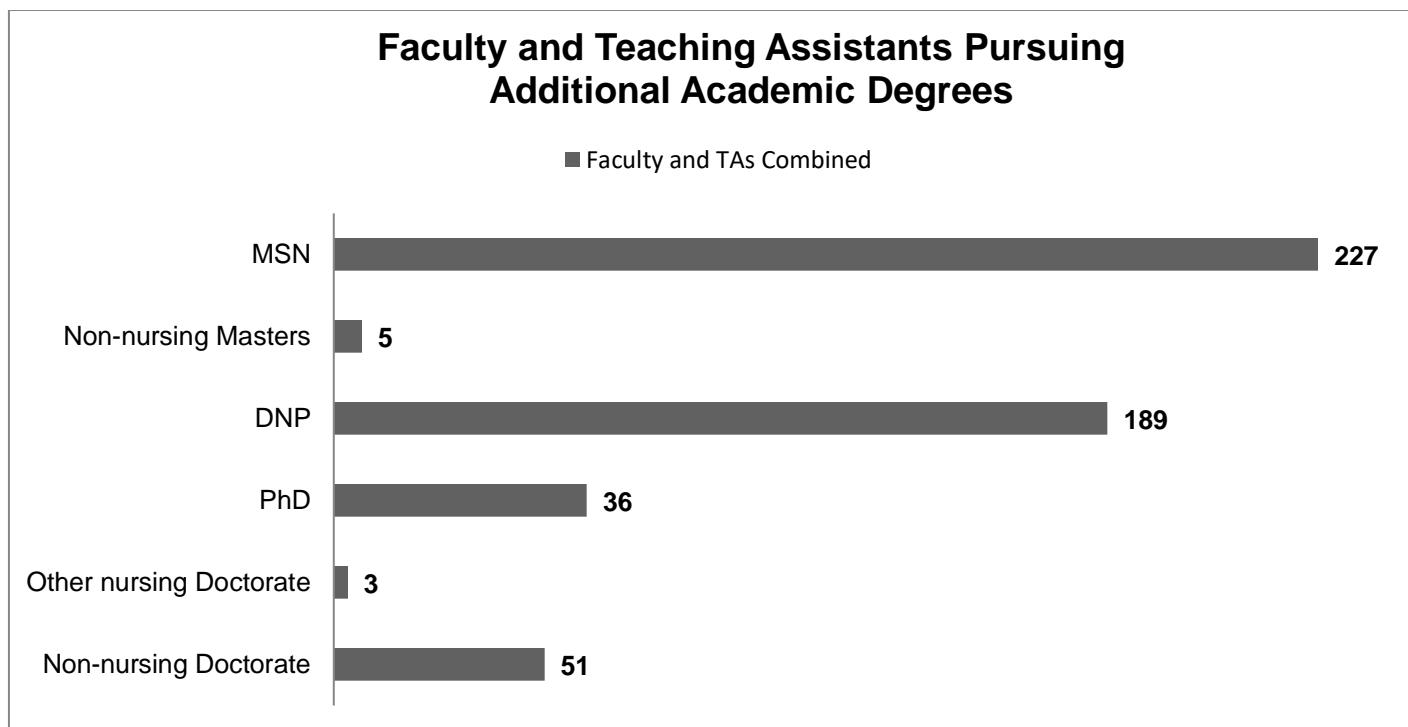

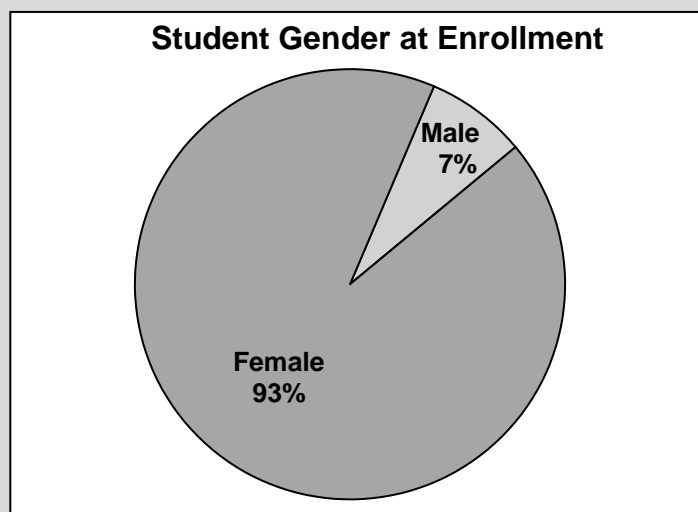

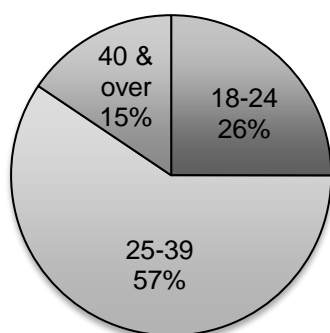

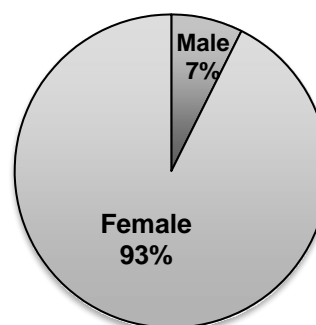

Student Gender at Completion PN



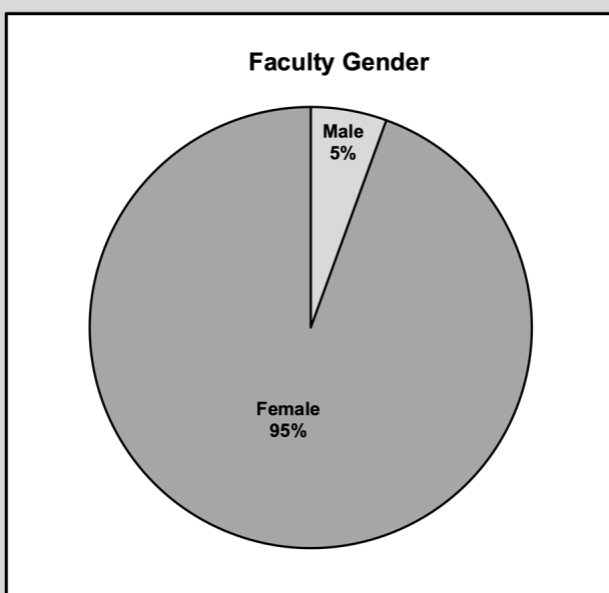

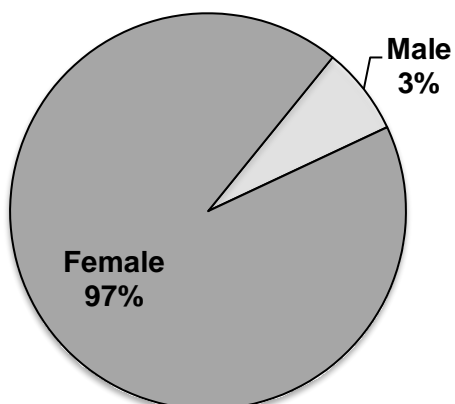

Teaching Assistant Gender



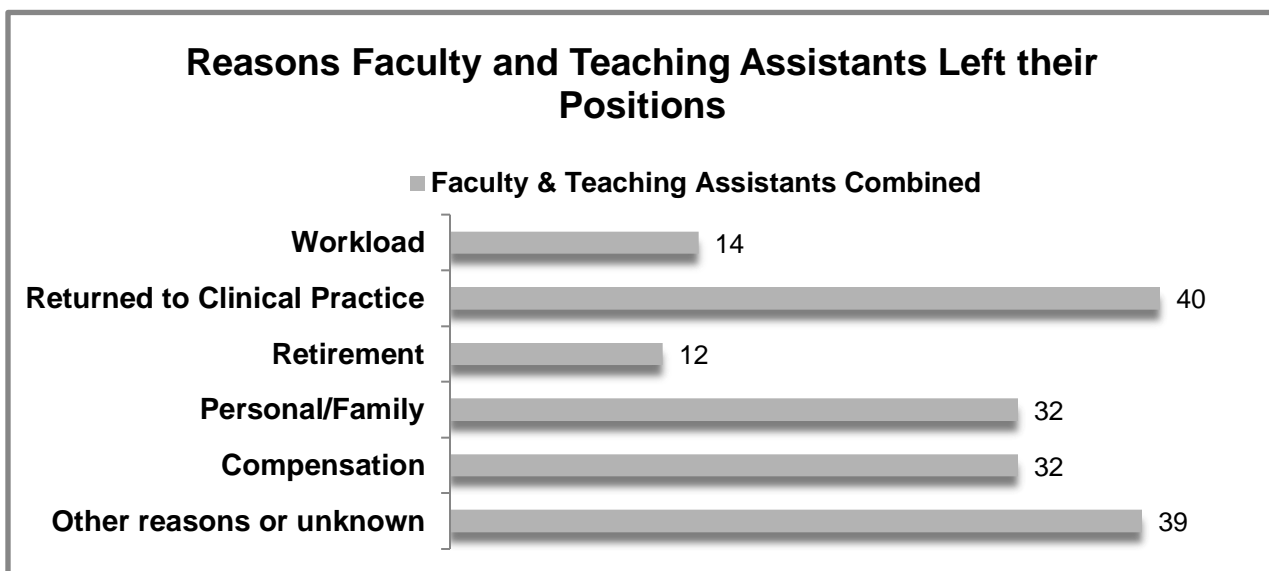

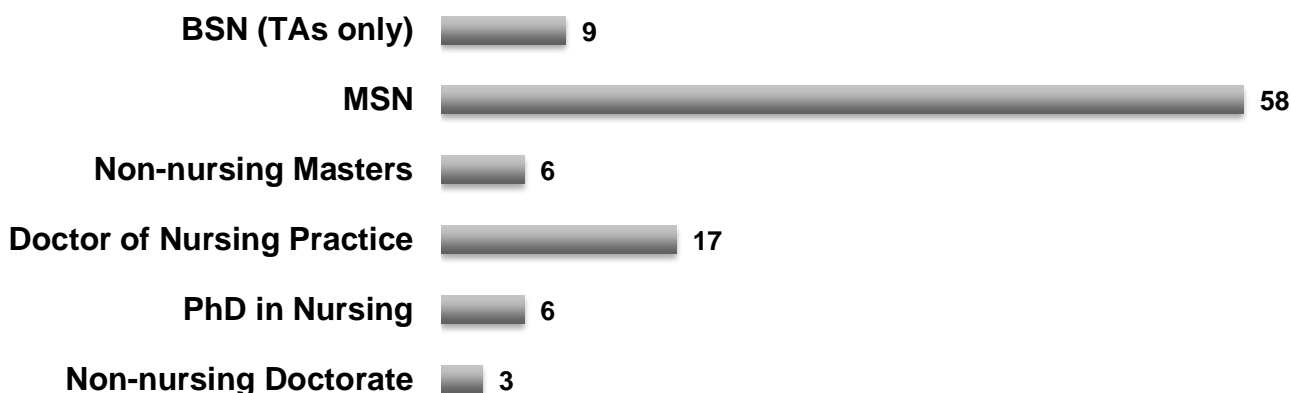
Faculty and Teaching Assistants Vacancies and Projections

Theory and Laboratory Experiences
